Marty Gibbons



As President of USW 1-417, an amalgamate local representing close to 2000 workers, Marty Gibbons has dealt with numerous grievances and arbitrations, and advocated for members at WorkSafeBC appeals.

He was appointed to and elected co-chair of the Southern Interior Health and Welfare Plan (SIHWP) and has served the plan members for more than a decade. In 2015 he was appointed to the IWA Forest Industry Pension plan, a plan with assets in excess of \$4 billion dollars. As a pension trustee he has participated in risk management and strategic planning.

Gibbons earned a Group Benefits Associate (GBA) through Dalhousie University and has received his GBA professional designation as a benefit trustee. In the last three years he completed a BCIT Occupational Health and Safety Certificate, graduating with distinction in June, and has applied and is working towards a Canadian Registered Safety Professional designation.

Gibbons is a strong social justice activist, working with groups such as the United Way, Kamloops Food Bank and Pit Stop Outreach Program.

Joey Hartman retired in 2018 from her position as president of the Vancouver & District Labour Council, representing 60,000 workers in the Vancouver area.

She offers over 36 years of leadership as a trade

union, community and social justice activist with extensive governance experience.
